

# OVERVIEW OF WSU/EAS ACCOMMODATIONS

The EAS office is responsible for providing appropriate academic adjustments for those persons with disabilities on campus.

Every student who registers with Educational Accessibility Services is required to provide this office with documentation of their disability/ies. The EAS uses the information to provide appropriate academic adjustments to meet the needs of an individual student.

**Prior to your appointment with an EAS counselor be sure to have all of your documentation in order. *You must have this documentation on file to receive EAS services.***

**You have two choices upon scheduling an appointment with an EAS counselor to review for your academic adjustments options.**

1. You may choose to have your documentation sent or faxed directly to the EAS office, 313-577-4898. You should follow up with a telephone call to confirm if EAS received your documentation and to schedule an appointment with an EAS counselor, 313-577-1851. OR
2. You can request the documentation be given or sent directly to yourself and upon receiving it, you are then encouraged to telephone the EAS office to schedule an appointment to speak with an EAS counselor to review your accommodation options. OR
3. You can come into the office during EAS Drop In Hours. Wednesday: 1:00 – 5:00 pm. Thursday: 8:30 am – 12:30 pm. Make sure you have the required documentation with you.
